

FATIMA A Global Mission "Like Mary, bearers of joy and love"



On 28th November last year the annual meeting at the Fatima Shrine to prepare for the New Pastoral Year 2020/2021 took place. The Shrine of Fatima will align the next three years of its

pastoral action with the preparation of the World Youth Day scheduled for 2023 in Lisbon.

As we seek to face up to and answer the new pastoral challenges raised by the pandemic, Father Carlos Cabecinhas, the Rector of the Shrine said, "We are always aware that next year will still be deeply marked by the pandemic situation and that we will face many difficulties, at different levels. But we believe that the message of Fatima is a message of hope and encouragement. It is also important to present the message of Fatima as an expression of God's concern for humankind suffering. As the message of Fatima invites us to intensify the experience of encounter with God, it necessarily implies Christian witness and the availability to go on a mission. "Like Mary, bearers of joy and love"

This, then, is the theme of the Shrine over the next three years as the Church in Portugal prepares to welcome the Holy Father and to celebrate World Youth Day. Through the Message of Fatima, we seek to go out to the world bringing the Light of Christ into the darkness of human hearts wounded by sin and desolate and empty amidst the poverty and injustice of our world. It is the desire of the Shrine to be a place of welcome and healing for all who are suffering especially in this time of pandemic.

Therefore, Fatima offers itself "as a message and place of hope by giving meaning to the experience of human frailty and suffering both by the message and the exemplary witness of the three children.

On the other hand, the rector highlighted Sister Lucia's Memoirs, when, in the June apparition at Cova da Iria, Our Lady promised her She would never abandon her: "Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart.

I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge." (Fourth Memoir).

In 2018, some of the members of WAF Scotland participated in the WAF Conference at Fatima. One of the speakers was Jose Moreno from Bogotá, Columbia. He gave a talk about the making of

statues of the Blessed Virgin Mary using a mould. This was accompanied with a DVD explaining the process. His vision is to encourage people, especially school children, to discover devotion to Our Lady of Fatima. The work involved in creating and painting the statues will help us to be 'moulded in Mary'. This would be a great opportunity for RE/Art Teachers to interact with children and, at the same time, promote the message of Fatima. It was St. Louis Marie de Monfort who used the beautiful image of Mary as 'the mould' of Christ. Those who entrust themselves to her maternal care and rest in her Immaculate Heart will discover themselves to be daily more and more conformed to Christ and moulded in his image and likeness.

Through the workings of Divine Providence, she became first of all the Vice-postulator and finally the Postulator of the cause of the canonisation of SS Francisco & Jacinta and finally the Vice-postulator of the cause of Lucia, which is still proceeding.

She offers wonderful insights not only into the meaning of the visions but also beautiful ways to connect them with our daily lives. She has been well educated in the teachings of the Second Vatican Council and in the teachings of the Church and the Popes on Mary and the rosary. In a beautiful way she brings all of these sources of knowledge to a unity. She also offers deep insights into the spirituality of the three children.
